Select Column A or B below, and answer all questions in that column. Remember we don't know you, and you're competing with overachievers. Your answers need to show us you're the kind of person we want to win our scholarship. \$2,000 for an RHS senior.

2. In no more than three sentences, compare and contrast a film/song/video/show that's a remake/reboot/pastiche/mashup with the original/inspiration/source material. Please don't use that many slashes in your response. For example, <i>Creed</i> vs. <i>Rocky</i> , <i>Star Wars</i> vs. <i>The Hidden Fortress</i> , "Gold Digger" vs "I Got a Woman", <i>Fargo</i> vs. <i>Fargo</i> , One Direction vs. The Monkees, so forth vs. what have you.	2. Create a Haiku using only the words from any Northwoods River News article. Include a link to the article you used. Example: hot hand from beyond being, contested moment we control our fate rivernewsonline.com/main.asp?SectionID=8&ArticleID=71129
3. Would you rather have ten million dollars or be able to speak every human language? Why?	3. After college, would you rather return to Rhinelander, never to leave, or be exiled from Rhinelander, never to return? Why? Please address the basic idea, not technicalities or exceptions.
4. Describe yourself with a plausible superlative in one sentence. For example, if this question were answering itself, it would say "Of all the questions numbered higher than 1, I am least changed from last year." You might say "I am the most observant flautist this side of the Mississippi."	4. If you could bring overwhelming shame on your family, your community, and everyone who has ever known you, how would you want to do it? For example, you might say "Start a fight as I'm losing the Super Bowl," or "Try to burn down the moon."

Whichever column you choose, Question 1 is the most important. Your answers should say a lot about who you are. A personal answer is usually better than an academic one, and it doesn't have to be written. Videos, music, pictures, non-perishable food items, and nonviolent robots are all acceptable. If you want to say something about speeding tickets or Miley Cyrus, please don't.
